Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Monday is an exciting day as it is the first day of school! Our teachers and staff have been busy getting the classrooms ready for what will be another great school year. The education ministry of our parish is an essential part of our Christian mission, and I am very proud of all of the work of our principal, Mrs. Sharon McCarthy-Allen, and her entire team who work day in and out to make Saint Stephen's the best

school in San Francisco. In a few weeks, the other programs of our education ministries will also commence with the start of our Faith Formation Program as well as the restart of the college campus ministry program. More information and updates on those programs will be forthcoming as we get closer to their start dates.

I would like to point out one slight change in the bulletin is our reporting of the collections. I have asked that we begin to just list the weekly collection count from the previous weekend rather than the current formatting. This will normally be the first collection and the second collection if there was a second collection. The donations we receive from online will be listed as an entire monthly total once the month concludes, since the donation pattern is different than the weekly offerings. We will discontinue at this time the total monthly expenses and our over/under in relation to donations collected since this method does not communicate an accurate representation of the overall financial health of our parish since monthly expenses dramatically fluctuate during the course of the year while donations tend to remain steady. One of the items I look forward to discussing with our parish finance council in the coming months is the best information to include in the bulletin and also providing an annual financial report to the parish. My personal goal is to have that ready in October or November. Stay tuned.

Finally, I want to express my gratitude for all of you who contribute to the temporal support of our parish community. Whether we like it or not, the Mission takes money, and it is because of the sacrificial offerings of all that we have such a wonderful parish. On a related financial note, I also want to express my thanks to everyone who has already contributed to the *2024 Archdiocesan Annual Appeal*. You will likely hear me say this at the start of next year's AAA, but my message is always that our "goal" for the AAA is not so much the monetary amount, but rather having participation from all the members of our parish community. A reminder that any shortfall in the amount that we do not collect for the AAA is taken from our general savings and any contributions in excess of our goal from the AAA are returned to the parish. There is a link on our website page to make a contribution online or you may use a brochure for the appeal as found in the church vestibule or parish office.

Our Saint of the Week Saint John Eudes Feast day - August 19



John, born in Normandy, France, in 1601, was educated by Jesuits. He became a priest and joined a religious community, the Oratorians. Using his gifts as a preacher and confessor, he gave parish missions. He saw that parish priests needed support in becoming men of prayer and action. He held conferences for them in which he

outlined their duties. Later, John started his own society of priests called the Congregation of Jesus and Mary. The members were dedicated to promoting good seminary training, which would form Christlike priests.

Christian love impelled John to feel compassion for the women who were trying to escape prostitution. He wanted a place for them to live, a refuge from their former way of life. To serve the women in these refuges, he established a society of religious women called the Congregation of Our Lady of the Refuge. It now serves the needs of troubled girls around the world.

Saint John Eudes has been called the Apostle of the Sacred Heart because he revived devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. He died in France in 1680.

The Bread of Life from Heaven is

the Body of Christ

The *Bread of Life*, or the Holy Eucharist, is the Sacramental Body of Christ. Theologians recognize four elements in this "Body *of Christ.*"



- 1) <u>The physical body</u> is the physical body of Christ, which was born in Bethlehem and died on Calvary.
- 2) <u>The risen body</u> is the transformed and glorified body of Jesus (I Cor 15: 35-49) in which Jesus appeared to his disciples.
- <u>The Mystical Body</u> is the Church which is the continuation of Jesus Christ on earth. Each baptized believer is an integral part (member), of the Mystical Body of Christ.
- 4) The Sacramental Body is related to and distinct from the above-mentioned bodies of Christ. During the Holy Mass, Jesus takes the bread and wine which we offer on the altar, offers it to God his Father and declares: "This is no longer your body, it is My Body; this is no longer your life's blood, it is My Blood." The Eucharist is, thus, Jesus' sacrificing himself, dying for us, and calling us to perform the same sacrifice for others. The Eucharist is the eternal sacrifice of Jesus providing life to those who eat his Body and drink his Blood. Thus, the Holy Mass is the Sacramental act which transforms our lives into the Divine Life. In each Mass, Jesus transforms us into other Christs - ritually, sacramentally and existentially - thus keeping his promise: "I will be with you till the end of the world.'

Touching the body of Christ

St. Teresa of Calcutta (Mother Teresa), had a rule that when a newcomer arrived to join her Order, the Missionaries of Charity, the very next day the newcomer had to go to the Home of the Dying. One day a girl came from outside India to join the Order. Mother Teresa said to her: "You saw with what love and care the priest touched Jesus in the Host during Mass. Now go to the Home for the Dying and do the same, because it is the same Jesus you will find there in the broken bodies of our poor." Three hours later the newcomer came back and, with a big smile, said to her, "Mother, I have been touching the body of Christ for three hours." "How? What did you do?" Mother Teresa asked her. "When I arrived there," she replied, "they brought in a man who had fallen into a drain and been there for some time. He

was covered with dirt and had several wounds. I washed him and cleaned his wounds. As I did so I knew I was touching the body of Christ." To be able to make this kind of connection we need the help of the Lord himself. It is above all in the Eucharist that he gives us this help.




THE SHIP OF THE CHURCH

How can this man give us his flesh to eat? This question shows the amazing lack of faith found among some of Jesus' followers. Their first mistake was to refer to him as a man instead of the Son of God. They wonder how he can become food for them, but many of them have seen his mighty deeds. In this very same chapter of



John's Gospel, Jesus has been seen walking on water and feeding thousands with five loaves and two fish. Clearly, he can do all things, including taking bread and wine and offering it as his own flesh and blood.

The Eucharist draws countless people to Mass, to adoration and to the Catholic Church every day. Sadly, where there is light there are also shadows. Many people who have left the Catholic Church cite one of the reasons being that they no longer believe what the Catholic Church teaches about the Real Presence of Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Statistics are alarming, but where Eucharistic faith is diminished, Mass attendance dwindles. Where Eucharistic belief is deeply rooted, faith flourishes.

It is our job – we who believe – to reawaken the Eucharistic faith of fellow believers and to go out and announce it to those who do not know that Jesus is the true bread sent from heaven. Why? Jesus answered that question for us – Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. We want to go to heaven. We want everyone to go to heaven. Jesus has made the Eucharist a vital and necessary means by which we obtain eternal life.

The first reading from Proverbs tells us to *forsake foolishness*. And Paul tells the Ephesians, *watch carefully how you live, not as foolish persons but as wise*. Where some believe it foolish to believe in God, in God's Son or in the Eucharist, for the person of faith who is open to the Word – it would be foolish not to believe. The world tells us this is myth, we say "no, it is mystery."

Those who wish to live forever would do well to acknowledge the truth of Jesus' words, and to eat his flesh and drink his blood, and to do so worthily. Then, we will have life because of him. Sadly, when children stop believing in Santa, the Easter Bunny and the Tooth Fairy, it would be all too easy for them to believe Jesus and the Eucharist to also be fairy tales. Again the question, *how can this man give us his flesh to eat*? The answer is simple yet profound – because he is God, because God is good, and because God is love.


