

## **Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Isaiah 25:6-10a, Psalm 23, Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20, Matthew 22:1-14

In every culture, food is an essential part of celebrations – from the wedding banquet to the Christmas meal. As families and friends we gather around the table, not just out of necessity, but because the time spent together there has emotional, spiritual, and human meaning. At the table, a deeper sense of unity among all is present; food unites as much as it nourishes. So we can understand why food, and the sharing of it, is so present throughout Scripture.

We see that image in today's readings from the great banquet foretold by Isaiah with its rich food and choice wines, to the wedding feast in the Gospel. Even Paul hints at it by referring to being well fed and living in abundance. Added to this, the wonderful Psalm 23, with its table



It makes sense that Jesus chooses this image to flesh out his teachings on the Kingdom. It would clearly have resonated with his audience, even if some, like the chief priest and elders, failed to understand it fully.

Like many, they failed to understand that while God invites all to his banquet, that invitation must be accepted. We respond by the way we live our lives. As the parable unfolds, some responses are clearly indifferent, but others seem to resent the intrusion of the invitation, and even respond with violence and hostility. Little do they know that by rejecting the invitation, they are also rejecting the King.

But the King does not give up. Why? Because, as Isaiah tells us, God generously wants all to share in his eternal banquet.

But is that the same as saying that all will be there at the great event? No! Like some in the parable, there will be some in this life who will refuse the Lord's invitation. Consumed by this world and its busyness, and concerned with earthly treasures, they lose sight of what is eternal.

How have we responded to that invitation? By gathering on this day, we recommit to our acceptance of it. Around the table of the Lord we find our deepest and truest identity, and the grace we receive encourages and strengthens us in our lifelong preparation for our attendance at the heavenly wedding feast. Here, today, we get a foretaste of that great and glorious banquet. May it strengthen our faith in the promise that awaits us at the heavenly banquet.


Take the strength you have received by participating in today's journey, use it to spread, as a disciple of Jesus, his divine message to those whom you come into contact with this day and always.

### October 20, 2023 - St. Paul of the Cross

Paul Francis Danei was born in Italy in 1694, the second of 16 children. Because of his father's financial difficulties, Paul had to leave school to help support his family. At age 15, he began to realize how much Jesus suffered for him. In response, he prayed and did difficult things such as sleeping on the floor and not eating foods he liked. He wanted to follow Christ more closely and share in his passion and death.

At age 20, Paul joined the Venetian army that was defending the faith. After a year, he went back to a life of prayer and penance. Then God called him to form a group of men dedicated to preaching parish missions. These men, called Passionists, would preach the mystery of Christ crucified—the mystery of the Father's love—in hopes that Christians would turn from their sins and rededicate their lives to Christ. Paul developed a method for giving parish mission talks that involved laypeople.

Paul received gifts of prophecy and healing from the Holy Spirit. He was so powerful when he preached and so gentle in confession that he brought many sinners back to the Lord. Paul once said, "England is always before my eyes, and if ever again it becomes Catholic, the benefit to the Church will be immeasurable." Within 65 years, a Passionist named Dominic Barberi went to England to help reconcile John Henry Newman and others to the Catholic Church, aiding the revival of Catholicism there. Paul of the Cross died in 1775.

## 2024 Mass Intention Book Now Open!


Due to a large volume of Mass requests and in order to be fair to the needs of our parishioners, the following is • the Mass Book Policy:

- 1. Only registered Parishioners can request up to a maximum of 10 masses/year. & only 2 of those Masses may be on weekends depending on availability - this makes it fair to all parishioners who wish to have a weekend Mass.
- 2. Mass intentions cannot be reserved by phone or via SMS. Requests must be submitted in writing or via email. You may drop your requests together with your donation payment at the Collection basket or at the Parish Mailbox or slow mail to the Parish Office.
- 3. Not all dates are available, so we ask that you be prepared with alternate dates and times. If your requested date is not available, an alternate next open date shall be chosen.
- 4. Mass Intentions are at least \$10 each. If you're paying • by check, Check Memo should indicate - Mass intention on xx/xx/23 (date) OR No. of Mass intentions;
- 5. Allow time for processing and provide your email or phone no. to confirm your masses.
