

Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Isaiah 45:1, 4-6, Psalm 96, 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5b, Matthew 22:15-21

Our allegiance to country – be it the United States or other nation – is important, but never more important than our allegiance to God. Our primary identity is not as citizens of a particular country, but as children of God. It is God to whom we belong, first and foremost. This is the message of today's readings.

Our first reading from Isaiah is about Cyrus, king of Persia, to whom the Lord gave power to subdue the Babylonians. Cyrus then allowed the captive Israelites to return to Jerusalem. This rebellion was accomplished, not for the sake of Cyrus or his kingdom, but for God's glory. Of primary importance is not belonging to the Babylonians or Persians, but belonging to God and knowing that there is none other besides him.

In the Gospel, Jesus' opponents try to entrap him on the question of taxation. Jesus' response is, *repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God*. Caesar's image and inscription are on the Roman coin. Thus, they belong to Caesar.

Jesus does not ask, but the next question is implied: Where do we find God's image and inscription? The answer is, in us, his children. God created us in his image and inscribed his law on our hearts. No matter what their allegiance to Rome, Jesus' message to his opponents is that they belong to God. Caesar may claim the coins to be his own, but he cannot claim people; they are claimed by God.

We are God's, we belong to him. We must repay to God what belongs to God. How do we do this? We do this by giving God our very selves: loving him with all our heart, all our soul, all our mind. We do this by giving God the best we have to offer: our first fruits of time, talent, and treasure. We do this by giving God our primary allegiance: putting God first, before nations or kingdoms, political or economic systems, institutions or ideologies.

Participating in the Eucharist, we are united with Christ and one another in offering our very selves to God. The grace of the sacrament strengthens our unity and allegiance to the One to whom we belong, now and forever.

October 20, 2023 - St. Anthony Claret

The well-liked Spanish priest Anthony Claret was the fifth of eleven children. His family was poor but hard working. Weaving was a family trade. Anthony's earliest memories of home were the family's praying the rosary and going to church. From this environment grew his deep love and devotion to Jesus and Mary.

By age twenty-one Anthony had been educated and was in much demand for his skill as a weaver. While suffering because of poor health, Anthony imagined himself as a Carthusian monk. He went to the bishop for advice. The bishop suggested that he first go to the diocesan seminary and then, if he wished, leave and become a monk. Anthony followed this advice and enjoyed seminary life.

Anthony was assigned as archbishop of Cuba. Not having had an archbishop for fourteen years, the island was in need of renewal. Anthony reorganized the seminary training, preached in all the churches, heard confessions, and guided people to Christ. He worked for updated farm methods and credit unions. He wanted the people to own their own farms, knowing that this would improve family life. He made enemies by teaching black slaves. Fifteen times people tried to assassinate him.

After eight years, Anthony was called to Spain to be Queen Isabella II's confessor. He obeyed unhappily. He and the queen agreed that he would not live at the palace but come only to hear her confession and instruct her children. This freed him to open a religious publishing house and write more than two hundred books and pamphlets.

In 1886 a revolution took place, and those associated with the court fled to Rome where Vatican Council I was in session. There he defended the infallibility of the pope. Then he returned to a Cistercian monastery in France where he stayed in solitude until his death.

2024 Mass Intention Book Now Open!

Due to a large volume of Mass requests and in order to be fair to the needs of our parishioners, the following is the Mass Book Policy:

- 1. Only registered Parishioners can request up to a maximum of 10 masses/year, & only 2 of those Masses may be
 on weekends depending on availability this makes it fair
 to all parishioners who wish to have a weekend Mass.
- 2. Mass intentions cannot be reserved by phone or via
 SMS. Requests must be submitted in writing or via
 email. You may drop your requests together with your
 donation payment at the Collection basket or at the Parish
 Mailbox or slow mail to the Parish Office.
- 3. Not all dates are available, so we ask that you be prepared with alternate dates and times. If your requested date is not available, an alternate next open date shall be chosen. Pls indicated deceased/bday blessing, etc
- 4. Suggested donation is <u>at least</u> \$10 for each Intention. If you're paying by check, Check Memo should indicate Mass intention on xx/xx/23 (date) OR No. of intentions;
- 5. Allow time for processing and provide your email or phone no. to confirm your masses.
