Speaking of preparing for Advent, as we prepare to enter the holy season of Advent, we invite each household to pick-up a copy of the Magnificat Advent Companion. OUR SAINT FOR THE WEEK: Catherine of Alexandria Feast Day November 25

Catherine lived in the Egyptian city of Alexandria during the reign of the Roman emperor Maxentius and was famous throughout the city for her beauty. She liked to spend her time reading and studying, which made her just as famous for her intelligence as she was for her good looks.

When Emperor Maxentius made a visit to Alexandria, (part of his empire) he heard about Catherine's beauty and

intelligence and demanded to meet her. As soon as he saw her, he decided he wanted to marry her. But Maxentius already had a wife. Maxentius (who continued to worship the ancient Roman gods) didn't think this mattered at all. He told her that he was the emperor and could have two wives at the same time. Catherine refused his proposal, saying that as a Christian she couldn't possibly agree to such a relationship.

Maxentius gathered a great number of teachers and professors who also believed in the Roman gods, to persuade Catherine that her Christian faith was nonsense. She listened to them and answered their points convincingly and persuasively. Instead of changing her mind, these wise men began to change their own minds. This angered the emperor. So he gave orders that Catherine should be put to death in a horrible way. A large wheel with sharp blades was made to cut her to pieces. When Catherine was bound to the wheel, it broke and the blades flew off in all directions, wounding the soldiers who were supposed to be putting her to death. Her executioners didn't try making another wheel. They beheaded her at once.

It is said that a flight of angels then descended from heaven and carried her body to Mount Sinai, where, centuries before, God had given the Ten Commandments to Moses.

Dear Fellow Parishioners of Saint Stephen,

A summary financial accounting for our parish for the 2023-2024 fiscal year will be available as a handout for you to take after Mass.

This fiscal year report is for your awareness as a means of building and maintaining transparency, accountability, and trust. I am grateful for the dedication and expertise of our parishioners on the finance council, the commitment of our parish staff, and the valuable support we receive from the Archdiocese of San Francisco's finance department and support corporations, which assist all parishes in managing human resources, benefits, finances, and facilities.

In summary, our parish ran an operating deficit last fiscal year of approximately \$270,000 which we covered with parish savings. The majority of our expenses are allocated toward compensation for lay employees and priests, along with property and liability insurance, utilities, and facility maintenance. Our primary source of regular income is the Sunday (first) collection. We rent our parish hall and gym for receptions, events, and sports camps, but this income depends on demand and is offset by maintenance and staffing costs.

Since Donworth Hall and Gym opened in 2010, the parish has been repaying a \$4.6 million loan that supplemented funds raised for the project. The outstanding balance is now about \$1.2 million, with full repayment expected around 2032. Each year, the parish contributes \$66,000 and the school \$185,000 toward the loan.

Our financial situation is a real concern and one that cannot continue for our parish's viability. I estimate that at our current rate of operational spending, our parish savings will be depleted in approximately two years. I am seeking the expertise of the finance council to advise me how best to navigate the challenge ahead of us.

Despite this financial challenge, this report is not provided so you will increase your giving or make special donations to financially assist the parish at this time. I know this will sound strange, but I believe it is more fruitful to first receive this information now and have those conversations later. I also hope that in future years, this report will not be solely a financial report, but a *stewardship* report which includes an accounting on how we as a community are stewards of not only our treasure, but of our time and talents in our ministries and outreach.

I believe our focus as a parish needs to be how we engage with our Christian faith as individuals and as a community. This is why our parish exists. Our entire parish community is made up of faith-filled people and our first call is to be missionary disciples of the Son of God. It is often said that one should focus on the mission first and the money will follow, and I think that is the appropriate starting point for our challenge. I want to encourage us all to be intentional with our faith and to invite others to become a part of our vibrant community, whether that means Catholics who are not involved or non-Catholics in the community.

If you have specific questions about our finances, please know I am available to answer any questions you may have. Please know of my prayers for all of us and please continue to pray for me.
