

Pastor's Corner

February 23, 2025

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This coming Saturday morning (March 1st), a group of our 8th graders will receive a particular gift of the Holy Spirit in the sacrament of Confirmation. Some people see Confirmation as simply a Catholic rite of passage, a moment of transition from childhood to becoming more mature. While the sacrament is often celebrated around this age, it is so much more than a ritual of adulthood. We look at the sacraments as ways the power of God is truly at work in our


lives through incarnate (physical) signs. Think about water for Baptism or bread and wine for the Eucharist as being ways in which the Lord transforms us. In the case of our young people, hands are laid on them and they are sealed with the Sacred Chrism holy oil, a symbol that God changes them and that he bestows his Spirit upon them for the rest of their lives. I should add that we say a *particular* gift of the Holy Spirit because the Spirit is already present to them (and us) so it is not as if the Holy Spirit was not there before. But in this sacrament, God bestows the Spirit upon them with the power of his grace with the gift of Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety, Fear of the Lord (i.e. Awe & Reverence). Please pray for them on Saturday as they prepare themselves to receive the Lord's graces and that for the rest of their lives, they realize the power and presence of the Lord who accompanies them throughout their lives.

Black Catholic on the Road to Sainthood

Venerable Father Augustus Tolton: A famous first who took the last place (1854-1897)

Father Augustus Tolton, born the son of slaves on April 1, 1854, became the first priest from the United States who was recognizably African American. After narrowly escaping slavery in Missouri with his mother and siblings, he reached maturity in Quincy, Illinois. There, the local pastor accepted him into the parish school despite opposition from parishioners.



"America has been called the most enlightened nation; we will see if it deserves that honor," said Cardinal Simeoni, "If America has never seen a Black priest, it has to see one now."

Father Tolton was sent back to Quincy, where he was met with racial prejudice by laity and clergy alike. He was maligned and mistreated by many, including his own brother priests. Father Tolton accepted this cross. He was invited to minister in Chicago in 1889, where Fr. Tolton was indefatigable in his efforts to serve a growing Black Catholic community and establish St. Monica Church for Black Catholics. This work, combined with a good deal of travel for speaking engagements on the plight of his people, took a toll on the priest. After returning from a retreat by train, Father Tolton collapsed on a Chicago street corner in record-breaking heat on July 9, 1897, and he died shortly thereafter.

Online Giving Transition

As we have been announcing in the bulletin, we are finally beginning the process of transitioning to a new platform for our online giving for our parish community. We are doing this to streamline our office operations from two platforms to a single plat-



form and to bring this and our parish database under one roof. We believe this will not only help office workflow but also save our parish money in the long term. The new provider may be a familiar Catholic company to some of you, Our Sunday Visitor (OSV). Besides being a publisher of books and news, they also support parishes with stewardship resources like online giving and envelopes.

During the period of transition, we ask that you stop your reoccurring offerings in the old platform (Realm or Vanco) and set them up in the new online platform with OSV. As we begin the transition, we will be starting with just our Sunday Offertory and Maintenance Fund. Over time, we will include other special collections. We will have the systems running parallel through the end of February at which time we will take the older systems offline.

One of our parishioners, Connie D'Aura, is available to assist parishioners make the transition to the new site if they encounter difficulties. You may reach out to her at donations@saintstephensf.org Users of the current/newer system (Realm) may follow the old links on the parish website to make their updates (saintstephensf.org/give). For parishioners using the older Vanco site, you may need to reach out to Connie for access and she will be able to assist you. Your profiles and giving history should be updated in the new OSV database.

Thank you very much for your patience and your sacrificial giving to our parish community.


