

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

This is the Fourth Sunday of Lent and is known as *Laetare* Sunday. It is one of two days of the liturgical calendar when the liturgical color is rose (not pink), the other being the Third Sunday of Advent. The word *laetare* is Latin for rejoice and comes from the Entrance Antiphon of the Mass. The Entrance Antiphon is technically what the Church sings as the "entrance hymn," though most parishes do not sing the antiphons. The full text of the Entrance Antiphon is: "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast." This is a reference/quotation from Isaiah 66:10-11. It is proper to rejoice today because we are halfway through the Lenten

season. As the difficulties of our sacrifices and penances weigh on us, the words of Isaiah may lift us up and give us new vigor as we look to complete our Lenten journey. Being halfway through Lent, it may be a good chance for each of us to ask ourselves how we are doing with what we set out to do in Lent? Just because we fell behind does not mean we give up but may hit the reset button, and as a prayer from Ash Wednesday says, complete our campaign of Christian service.

One of the practices many of the faithful try to do during Lent is to go to Confession. As you know, we have regular Confessions offered before our weekend Masses. There is also going to be a Sunset Deanery Reconciliation service with individual Confession held at Saint Cecelia's on Monday, April 14 at 7:00 PM. There will be priests from the neighboring parishes, so this is an opportunity for a wider selection of Confessors in one convenient location. Of course, most parishes post their Confession times online so you can always check out other parishes and their regular Confession times for a time that works for you.

This is the final reminder that we are turning off our old online donation platforms with Vanco and Realm at the end of the month. Starting this week, online donations will be exclusively through our new provider of Our Sunday Visitor. If you have not checked recently, we added the various second collections to the online platform as well as our regular Sunday Offertory, Maintenance Fund, and 75th Anniversary Fund. Starting in May, Our Sunday Visitor will also be our new offertory envelope provider. I will write more about that when we receive our first set of envelopes. For your information, your Pastor receives offertory envelopes too, but that is so I can check them to make sure they are correct. I prefer to donate online.

Online Giving Transition

As we have been announcing, we are almost done with the process of transitioning to a new platform for our online giving for our parish community. We are doing this to streamline our office operations from two platforms to a single platform and to bring



this and our parish database under one roof. We believe this will not only help office workflow but also save our parish money in the long term. The new provider may be a familiar Catholic company to some of you, Our Sunday Visitor (OSV). Besides being a publisher of books and news, they also support parishes with stewardship resources like online giving and envelopes.

During the period of transition, we ask that you stop your reoccurring offerings in the old platform (Realm or Vanco) and set them up in the new online platform with OSV. We will have the systems running parallel through the end of March at which time the older systems will go offline.

One of our parishioners, Connie D'Aura, is available to assist parishioners make the transition to the new site if they encounter difficulties. You may reach out to her at donations@saintstephensf.org Users of the current/newer system (Realm) may follow the old links on the parish website to make their updates (saintstephensf.org/give). For parishioners using the older Vanco site, you may need to reach out to Connie for access and she will be able to assist you. Your profiles and giving history should be updated in the new OSV database.

Our Saint of the Week Saint Francis of Paola

Saint Francis of Paola, O.M. was an Italian mendicant friar and the founder of the Roman Catholic Order of Minims. Unlike the majority of founders of men's religious orders, and like his patron saint, Francis was never ordained a priest. But he is considered to be a patron saint of **boatmen**, **mariners**, **and naval officers**. His liturgical feast day is celebrated by the Roman Catholic Church on April 2nd, the day on which he died.



He was an Italian contemplative hermit who founded the Hermits of St. Francis of Assisi in 1474, also known as the "Minims" because of their commitment to humility and continual penance. St Francis was born in the town of Paola, which lies in the southern Italian Province Calabria. In his youth he was educated by the Franciscan friars in Paola. His parents, having remained childless for some years after their marriage, had recourse to prayer and especially commended themselves to the intercession of Francis of Assisi, after whom they named their first-born son. Two other children were eventually born to them.

When still in the cradle, Francis suffered from a swelling which endangered the sight of one of his eyes. His parents again had recourse to Francis of Assisi and made a vow that their son should pass an entire year wearing the "little habit" of St Francis in one of the friaries of his Order, a not-uncommon practice in the Middle Ages. The child subsequently recovered. At the age of 13, being admonished by a vision of a Franciscan friar, he entered a friary of the Franciscan Order to fulfill the vow made by his parents.



The "Original" Youth Group for Teens!

Perhaps it was its dedication to The Blessed Mother, or perhaps the caliber of its first officers and charter members, or its sponsorship by the Women's Guild and the Men's Club, or perhaps the undeniable strength of these forces combined, but in whatever sphere of influence lies the success of The Marian Club, nevertheless this group of teen age high school students founded in September 1950, has already achieved undisputed first place among similar organizations in the entire metropolitan area.

The first officers were: Kevin Cook, President; Virginia Leishman, Vice-President; Arlene Burke, Secretary; Cecilia Ward, Treasurer; Dick Harms, Sergeant-at-Arms, and Bill Doyle, Committee Chairman.
