


Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Next weekend, August 2 & 3, we will have a guest missionary priest celebrating and preaching at our Sunday weekend Masses. His name is Father Emmanuel Adams of the Diocese of Ilorin, Nigeria. His visit is coordinated as part of the Archdiocese of San Francisco Missionary Cooperation Plan which arranges to have a missionaries visit all of the parishes of the Archdiocese during the course of the year. Next weekend, I hope to be able to have a brief bio of Father Adams for the bulletin.

As part of the Missionary Cooperation Plan, special yellow offertory envelopes will be available in the church next weekend if you choose to make a donation. The monies that are collected are sent to the Archdiocese of San Francisco Mission Office where they are pooled with the missionary collections from other parishes, and each sponsoring diocese or religious order receives a portion of the total funds collected. This is done to ensure equity as not all parishes have similar financial means. Otherwise, speakers would only desire to go to certain parishes that would offer more financial support. However, all Catholics have the same obligation to support the missionary activities of the Church throughout the world and by pooling our resources, this ensures that missionaries speak at every parish and the important work of the missions will be made know to all.

With a guest priest visiting and celebrating Masses for us, I am taking the opportunity to be away for the weekend as I spend some vacation time with my parents. Our Saint of the Week: St. James



St. James is called James the Greater, possibly because he followed Christ before the other apostle named James. Very early in his public life, Jesus called James to follow him. Along with Peter and John, James was one of

the favored three to witness the Transfiguration of Jesus, the raising of Jairus's daughter, and the agony in the garden on Holy Thursday night. James and John were known as Boanerges, which means "sons of thunder." They seem to have had strong tempers. We read in Matthew 20:20-28 that the mother of James and John once asked Jesus to give her sons a high position in his kingdom. When Jesus asked the two brothers if they could endure the same suffering he was going to endure, they both said yes. We do not know very much about James' life. Tradition says he may have traveled to Spain. During the Middle Ages there was a famous shrine to St. James at Compostela in Spain. Luke records in the Acts of the Apostles: "It was about this time that King Herod started persecuting certain members of the Church. He beheaded James, the brother of John" (Acts 12:1-2). James is thought to have been the first apostle martyred. St. James is a very popular saint in England, where more than four hundred churches are dedicated to him.
