

This coming Friday, August 15, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary which is a Holy Day of Obligation. We will have two Masses on Friday, 8:00 AM and 6:00 PM. As we have been announcing, after the evening Mass we will have a special concert to honor our Blessed Mother and celebrate our 75th Anniversary year. There will be light refreshments following the Mass. The concert is free, but offerings will be accepted. I hope many of you will be able to make it for the event and please spread the word about the event. You may attend another Mass earlier during the day and just come for

the concert.

As we approach the end of summer, this an invitation for our families who attend the public or other private schools to sign up their children for faith formation. Background on today's Gospel Reading

Jesus' instructions on how to be ready for the coming judgment continue in the stories and sayings found in today's Gospel. We are not to be like the greedy rich man in last Sunday's Gospel who planned to store his great harvest in barns rather than share it. We are, rather, to share our wealth with those in need. The antidote for the anxiety brought on by the coming judgment is to relinquish our possessions and provide for the needs of others. Our treasure will be in heaven where it will not wear out or be destroyed.

The other major way to be ready for the coming judgment is to be watchful. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus tells a parable about watchfulness to begin making this point. We must be like servants waiting for the master's return from a wedding banquet, which, even now, can last for a few days in the Middle East. We must be watchful so that even if the master comes after midnight, we will be ready for him. This is what the coming of the Son of Man will be like.

Peter asks if this parable is meant for the apostles or for the large crowd that has gathered to listen to Jesus. Without answering Peter's question, Jesus responds with another parable about servants awaiting the return of their master. It begins with a question: "Who, then, is the faithful and prudent steward whom the master will put in charge of his servants to distribute the food allowance at the proper time?" This parable adds to the theme of watchfulness; it explains how to wait and reminds us of the reward for the faithful follower at the heavenly banquet after the judgment. If it is addressed to the apostles, then it could also be addressed to leadership in the early Church. Either way, the parables reminds us that we should be found doing our jobs when the master arrives.

FEAST of the ASSUMPTION of the BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Friday, August 15 is the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary - A Holyday in the life of our Church. Catholics are obligated to attend Mass on this day.

Thoughts on the ASSUMPTION

Mary's Assumption gives us the assurance and hope of our own resurrection and assumption into heaven on the day of our Last Judgment. It is a sign to us that someday, through God's grace and our good life, we, too, will join the Blessed Mother in giving glory to God. It points the way for all followers of Christ who imitate Mary's fidelity and obedience to God's will.

Since Mary's Assumption was a reward for her saintly life, this feast reminds us that we, too, must be pure and holy in body and soul, since our bodies will be glorified on the day of our resurrection. St. Paul tells us that our bodies are the temples of God because the Holy Spirit dwells within us. He also reminds us that our bodies are members (parts) of the Body of Christ.
