

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Over a week ago, tragedy once again struck our nation. Innocent lives were lost and another community is heartbroken. The only true response to violence is peace and the strength for peace comes from prayer. All of us should call upon the Lord for his gift of peace for ourselves and our fellow human beings as too many people throughout the world are living lives blind to God's peace in their hearts. At our school, Mrs. Allen

and her team have been working tirelessly to ensure that not only do we have the best learning environment possible, but also the safest school possible. At our church, we are also doing our best to ensure a safe worship environment, a place where all may come to encounter the living God. Over the past several months, we made some security enhancements around the parish property and recently, further modifications to help keep our campus safe. While we do not want to fall into paranoia, we do want to remain vigilant. As the saying goes, no matter where we are, if we see something, we should say something to help keep one another safe.

As we have been announcing, Sunday, October 19 will be the main celebration of our parish's 75th Anniversary Year. To emphasize the importance of the celebration and gathering as a community for prayer, we will be modifying the Mass schedule for that weekend. On Saturday, October 18, we will have the regular 4:30 PM Saturday Vigil Mass. On Sunday, October 19, there will be no 8:00 AM or 6:30 PM Mass but only the 10:30 AM Mass.

We know this may be an inconvenience for some of you but for special occasions, it is sometimes important to do things differently. We will be posting this for the next several weeks so by then, people will know the schedule. We are beginning to sell tickets for the luncheon which will take place after the 10:30 AM Mass. You may purchase tickets online through the event registration page or via check/cash and use the special registration envelops that we are providing. Background on today's Gospel Reading

In chapter 14 of Luke's Gospel, Jesus is speaking to people gathered at the table about the difficulties of following him. This group of people is suspicious about Jesus, looking to catch him doing something wrong. Jesus speaks to them in parables, emphasizing that although there is a right



way to be a disciple and enter into the kingdom of his Father, it is a difficult path to follow. Many, even some of the guests at the table, reject the invitation. So Jesus turns to the crowds and speaks to them of discipleship. Jesus explains that, when it comes to making a choice for the Kingdom of God, nothing can get in the way. When Jesus describes "hating" one's father and mother, he is not talking about feelings. Rather, he is emphasizing very strongly that choosing to be a disciple means that everything else—family, money, your own life—must come second. In Matthew's version of this story (Matthew 10:37), Jesus refers not to "hating" father or mother, but to loving them more than Jesus. Jesus makes it very clear that being a disciple is not easy. It means to bear one's own cross. These difficult savings of Jesus are followed by two brief parables (a person constructing a tower and a king marching into battle) that make an obvious point—don't start what you cannot finish. Discipleship is difficult and is something we can commit to only if we are prepared to put the Kingdom of God before everything else.
