

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Thank you very much for everyone who made last Sunday's 10:30 AM Mass in honor of Saint Francis of Assisi with the blessing of the animals such a huge success. A special thanks to our 5th graders who helped to lead us in our prayer, some of our 8th graders who helped to setup the chairs, and to Deacon Olet Abad, Mary Molly Mullaney, Mrs. Haley (5th grade), and Mrs. Jimenez (8th grade). Of course, thanks be to God for providing us with wonderful weather.

Next weekend we will have our special celebration to mark our parish's 75th Anniversary. Many of our fellow parishioners have been working extra hours to make the celebration a special event. We hope many of you will be able to attend the 10:30 AM Mass and the luncheon in Donworth Hall. This **Sunday (10/12) is the deadline to purchase tickets** because we need to know how much food to purchase. So, either please return your envelopes to parish office or purchase a ticket online. This is also your final reminder that next weekend, we will only have the Saturday 4:30 PM Mass and Sunday 10:30 AM Mass. There will be no 8:00 AM or 6:30 PM Mass next Sunday.

At Saint Stephen's, we practice the traditional custom during the month of November of recalling particular people who are deceased and making a special offering to God in our prayers and Masses that we celebrate throughout the month. If you receive the parish offertory envelopes, there is an envelope included in your packet for All Souls'. We are also placing extra envelopes in the vestibule which you may begin to complete and return either to the parish office or in the collection baskets. We will be placing these names on our altar throughout the month of November as we remember all those who have preceded us in death.

I am grateful and excited to share that I have been accepted into *Eius*, an ongoing priestly formation service by Catholic Leadership Institute designed to help priests navigate the complexities of ministry and rekindle the fire of their priesthood first ignited at ordination. One of my responsibilities as a priest is to continue my formation to ensure that I am not only growing as a disciple of Jesus, but that I am growing as a shepherd in my call to be His priest and by extension, yours. *Eius* is a nine-month journey of human, spiritual, intellectual, and pastoral formation, offered through both virtual and in-person experiences. I will be attending in-person sessions in Saint Louis three times over the next nine months, the first gathering being October 20-23 (right after our big celebration). I look forward to how God will use this time to deepen my priesthood and bless our parish for years to come. Please keep me in your prayers as I begin this journey. Know that I will be praying for you as well.

Background on the Gospel

Today we hear about how Jesus, continuing on his journey to Jerusalem, heals 10 lepers. This story is a lesson about faith and reminds us that faith is sometimes found



in unlikely places. Ten people afflicted with leprosy cry out to Jesus. Struck with pity, Jesus heals all 10. However, only one is described as glorifying God and returning to thank Jesus. The one who returns is a Samaritan, a foreigner. In the Jewish circles in which Jesus lived, Samaritans were looked down upon because of the differences between the two communities in their observance of Judaism. It is significant, therefore, that Jesus commends the Samaritan for his faith, which has been his salvation. Throughout Luke's Gospel, faith is found in surprising places.

Another lesson for us in this Gospel has to do with salvation. All 10 of the lepers were given the gift of healing, but in his gratitude to God for this gift, the Samaritan found salvation. Our salvation is found in recognizing the gifts we have been given and knowing to whom we must offer our thanks.
