**Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,**

Thank you to the Men's Club for last Sunday's spectacular pancake breakfast. A special recognition to the breakfast team: Doug Kilroy, Greg Teshara, Andrew Ng, John Gartland, Robert Del Real, Jeff Pasquini, Sean Conlan, Kogi Kumagi, and Marc Passetti. Thank you as well to Men's Club President Patrick Kennedy and our Principal Mrs. Allen for helping to organize the breakfast and the toy drive through the SF Fire Department. We want to also thank our firefighters from Station 19 who came to help serve breakfast and bring their fire engine for our future first responders.



As I mentioned last weekend, we were able to move forward with replacing the boiler for the rectory at Saint Stephen's which was one of the projects we identified as part of our 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Fund. I learned during this process that the system is a hydronic boiler which heats water which then flows through small baseboard radiators throughout the rectory, as well as two sacristy rooms in the church. Working with the Archdiocese of San Francisco Real Property Support Corporation who assists in large maintenance projects, we solicited several bids and the Finance Council and I decided on Cornely Company in San Francisco, which has done work at various parish sites in the area. There were two parts to this project, replacing the boiler itself, and then work on the radiators themselves. The boiler replacement which included the removal of the old boiler and some asbestos abatement came to \$46,500. The work on the radiators was \$13,864.74. The total was \$60,364 which was just over the 60k we were projecting for the project.

Of course, this week we celebrate Christmas and the schedule of Masses is in the bulletin. Whether for Christmas Eve or Christmas Day, we look forward to seeing you at Mass. Welcome as well to all the family members and friends who are visiting from out of town. On behalf of Mrs. Allen and our entire pastoral staff, we pray that all of you have a very blessed Christmas.

**Background on the Gospel Reading**

Finally, on this the Fourth Sunday of Advent, our Gospel Reading permits us to begin our contemplation of the mystery of the Incarnation we celebrate at Christmas: "Now this is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about" (Matthew 1:18). The Gospel of Matthew tells the story of the birth of Jesus from Joseph's perspective. Today's Gospel passage is the second movement in this story. In the preceding verses of the first chapter of Matthew's Gospel, the Evangelist has listed the genealogy of Jesus, tracing his lineage through King David to Abraham. In the chapter to follow, Matthew tells of the visit from the Magi, the Holy Family's flight into Egypt, and Herod's massacre of the infants in Bethlehem. (The other stories which we associate with Christmas, the Annunciation, the Visitation, the angel and the shepherds, are found in the Gospel of Luke).

We must not gloss over too quickly the difficult circumstances described in today's Gospel. The way that Joseph and Mary face these circumstances tells us much about these holy people and their faith in God. Joseph and Mary are betrothed to be married. This is sometimes described as an engagement period, but it is more than that. Betrothal in first century Jewish culture was in fact the first part of the marriage contract. A breach of this contract was considered adultery. Mary is found to be with child. If adultery is proven, the punishment might be death. Joseph has rights under Mosaic law, but chooses to act discreetly in his plans to break the marriage contract, so as to protect Mary. Then God intervenes.

The message of the angel of the Lord given to Joseph in his dream tells us much about the child that Mary bears and his role in God's plan. He is conceived by the Holy Spirit. His name will be Jesus, which in the Hebrew means "Yahweh saves." He will be the fulfillment of the prophecy heard in today's first reading from Isaiah: "... The virgin shall be with child . . . and shall name him Emmanuel [God with us]."

Joseph does as the angel of the Lord directs. He takes Mary to be his wife and accepts the child in her womb as his own. Joseph and Mary are both cooperative with God's plan. They are both models for us of what it means to be faithful servants of God.

**Simbang Gabi at St. Stephen Church in San Francisco, CA.** Simbang Gabi began in San Francisco in 1996. is now held in approximately 45 parishes in the Archdiocese of San Francisco, with an annual Simbang Gabi Commissioning rites at the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption. Historical accounts show that **Simbang Gabi novena Masses, introduced in the early 1600**, came from the original novena Masses in preparation for Christmas in honor of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, that have existed for hundreds of years in Spain.
