



### Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This week, we celebrate Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the sacred season of Lent. On Ash Wednesday, we will have two Masses with the distribution of ashes: 8:00 AM and 6:30 PM.

As a former colleague of mine would say, Lent is a time for the whole Church to go on retreat as we reflect on our faithfulness as disciples of the Lord and look to renew our life with him. We do this through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving/charitable works.

During the Lenten season, you are invited to join us in the Church on Friday evenings at 6:00 PM to pray the Way of the Cross with the community. In this traditional devotion, we accompany Jesus and meditate on his Passion and Death. You are also invited to attend the two evening Soup Suppers we will hold this year in Donworth Hall. They are on February 26 and March 12 at 6:00 PM. More information will be in the bulletin on these events.

Finally, we are distributing to the parish community the Lenten Companions from Magnificat. I know many of you enjoy these booklets with daily reflections throughout the Lenten season to prayerfully enter into this sacred time. The booklets are available in the vestibule, and we ask that you please take just one per household so there will be enough for everyone.

### Background on Today's Gospel Reading

Matthew continues the Sermon on the Mount with a three part instruction by Jesus on the Way of Life in the kingdom of heaven. Today's reading is part one and deals with the Law. Part two deals with worship and religious practice and contains the Lord's Prayer. Part three deals with trusting God and deeds of loving service to our neighbor.

When Matthew speaks of "the Law and the prophets" he means the whole Scripture. When the Messiah brings the fullness of the kingdom none of scripture will be done away with. Instead it will be fulfilled. Matthew's Jesus does not overturn the Law of Moses, nor does he set his followers free from the Law. He requires his followers to go beyond the Law by doing more than the Law requires.

The Law condemned murder. Jesus condemns anger. The Law condemned adultery. Jesus condemns even lustful looks. As Jewish Christians who had always been faithful to the Law Matthew's community need a way to understand the difference Jesus and the kingdom he brings have made. They affirmed that God had always been at work in history through "the Law and the prophets." But God's work goes beyond that to be embodied by the Messiah who reveals the definitive will of God. The written scriptures and their interpretation in tradition are surpassed by Jesus whose life and teaching are the definitive revelation of the will of God.

## OUR FASCINATING FAITH

The Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order. On February 17 we honor the seven founding saints of the Order of the Servants of the Virgin Mary. Bonifilius, Alexis, Manettus, Amideus, Hugh, Sostene and Buonagiunta were a group of merchants of Florence who, upon experiencing an apparition of the Blessed Virgin in 1233, renounced their businesses, left what was necessary for their families, and distributed the rest among the poor. They then dedicated themselves entirely to the veneration of the Virgin Mary, going to live on an Italian mountain, each assuming the life of a hermit—prayer, extreme fasting and penance. Sometime later, at the request of the pope's delegate, all but one were ordained priests. Brother Alexis, considering himself unworthy of the priesthood, decided to remain as a brother. They were all canonized in 1888. Their feast day, originally February 11, now falls on the 17th, the date of the death of the last of the seven founders.
